

Chain Ray Conflict Minerals Policy

Chain-Ray is committed to provide higher value for employees, suppliers, customers, and society. Our Conflict Minerals Policy aim to support the international responsible sourcing standards, set by the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). We support the Conflict Minerals Regulation which aims to help stem the trade in conflict minerals (tantalum, tin, tungsten, gold, and cobalt) which sometimes finance armed conflict or are mined using forced labor or abuse of local communities. We encourage our supply chain partners to conduct due diligence concerning the necessary conflict minerals in the products they manufacture or contracts to manufacture in accordance with the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT) developed by the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI).

According to the policy, we would, and also request our suppliers to:

- (1) Conduct business operations in a way of social and environmental responsibility.
- (2) Not use the conflict minerals originated from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and its adjoining countries.
- (3) Trace \(\) investigate and declarer the origins of the metals used when conflict minerals are identified based on the principles of the OECD Guidance.
- (4) Request our suppliers to complete our conflict minerals survey and provide the origins of the metals used when necessary.
- (5) Make the same requirements to upstream suppliers.
